Frequently Asked Questions:

How often will my student attend HIT?

Students are selected by different departments for individual support weekly. It is possible that some students will be involved more often than others.

Where will HIT be held?

The student's HIT invitation will specify where, at school, their HIT session will take place.

What happens if a student cannot go home?

Supervision will be provided, at school, by school staff for students who are not able to go home by 1:30 pm.

How are students to get home Friday after 1:10 pm?

Students may walk, ride a bike, be picked up by a parent/ carer or catch a bus. Specific details regarding bus arrangements will be communicated to students and parents/carers.

What are Year 11 students doing after 1:30 pm Friday?

Year 11 students are part of the Hawk Development Program delivered and supervised by school staff on Friday afternoons.

What are Year 12 students doing after 1:30 pm Friday?

Year 12 students will go home unless they are selected to participate in a HIT session.

Hawk Intervention Time is scheduled to occur on Fridays from 1:50 pm to 3:00 pm.

What happens if a student is not required for Hawk Intervention Time (HIT)?

Students not selected to attend HIT will go home after 1:10 pm on Fridays. Students may walk, ride a bike, be picked up by parent/carer or catch a bus. Specific details regarding bus arrangements will be communicated to students and parents/carers.
