

UNIFORM AND STUDENT PERSONAL PRESENTATION POLICY AND PROCEDURES

Harristown State High School is a uniform school. The uniform policy has been endorsed by the Parents' & Citizens' Association.

There are three key factors in school's uniform policy: identification of the correct uniform, the procedures and a student's personal presentation.

Students must wear full dress uniform on all excursions and official functions, unless otherwise stated.

PROCEDURES

Harristown SHS is committed to providing support and assistance to students and their parent/carers in enabling each student to be in the correct uniform every day that they attend school.

The following procedures apply:

- any student not in correct uniform is to report to the Trade Training Centre to exchange items for the correct uniform.
- the Trade Training Centre will be staffed during the hours 8.30am – 9.20am and 3.00pm – 3.15pm.
- any incorrect item will be exchanged and recorded.
- if no substitute item is available, the student will be given an incorrect uniform note that needs to be shown to any staff member, upon request.
- the incorrect item will be retained at the Trade Training Centre until the end of the school day, when the borrowed item will be returned.
- if a student attends a class in the incorrect uniform after 9.15am, they will be sent to their House Deputy Principal.
- the House Deputy Principal will arrange for the student to be given the correct uniform in exchange for the incorrect item.
- a text will be sent to the parent/carer advising that their child was not in correct uniform.

STUDENT PERSONAL PRESENTATION

Harristown SHS is committed to supporting and assisting students to maintain high standards of personal presentation to reflect community standards. In setting these standards the school has been mindful of

- balancing the rights of individual students with the best interests of the whole school community;
- compliance with health and safety considerations, and
- anti-discrimination legislation.

Jewellery

- 2 pairs of earrings (no larger than a 5 cent piece).
- 1 discreet nose stud
- 1 discreet necklace to be concealed by shirt.
- 1 watch.
- 1 discreet ring.
- 1 discreet bracelet

Hair – Natural coloured.

Makeup – Natural coloured.

Nail Polish – Natural coloured.

Facial Piercing – Clear, covered or removed.



PROCEDURES

The following will apply:

1. a staff member will identify any aspect of a student's appearance which does not comply with the student personal presentation policy.
2. the student is to take action that allows them to become compliant with the policy.
3. the student may access the means to remove make up and nail polish if necessary.
4. the student and/or staff member may seek clarification from Deputy Principal in any matter pertaining to this policy.
5. failure to comply with teacher directions in this regard will be considered as a non-compliance behaviour issue, and the teacher will send a red card to the office.
